## Course Outcomes (CO) Highlights by Department

The 2024-25 curriculum focuses on the following key areas for the undergraduate students:

### Humanities & Social Sciences

1. **Department of Hindi:** Outcomes focus on linguistic history, creative writing, and the relevance of 'Riti' and 'Aadi' Kaal literature in modern social contexts.
2. **Department of Political Science:** Students are expected to demonstrate an understanding of the Indian Constitution, local self-government (*Panchayati Raj*), and international relations.
3. **Department of Sociology:** Focuses on understanding the social structure of rural India, specifically issues related to the Azamgarh region and women's empowerment.
4. **Department of History:** Outcomes include the ability to interpret findings and understand the cultural evolution of North India.

### Commerce

- **Department of Commerce:** Students achieve mastery in financial accounting, GST regulations, and entrepreneurship skills tailored for the rural economy.

### Science

Department	Key Focus Areas and Outcomes
Physics	Understanding the principles of Renewable Energy (Solar/Biomass) and its application in rural infrastructure and agricultural tools.
Chemistry	Mastery of Soil and Water Testing techniques, focusing on local agricultural health and chemical safety in the domestic environment.
Zoology	Knowledge of Animal Husbandry and the ecology of local fauna, with an emphasis on public health and disease prevention (e.g., vector-borne diseases).
Botany	Expertise in Medicinal Plants of the Azamgarh region and sustainable farming practices to enhance local biodiversity in Ahiraula region.

## Assessment & Attainment (2024-25)

To measure these outcomes, the college utilizes a multi-layered evaluation system:

1. **Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE):** 25% weightage (Assignments, Attendance, and Class Tests).
2. **End-Semester Examination:** 75% weightage (University-conducted).

3. **Skill Development Courses:** Mandatory vocational courses designed to enhance ‘Job Readiness’.

Overall, for the 2024-25 session, the college has prioritized Women’s Leadership as a cross-cutting outcome. The integration of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) allows students to track these outcomes across different years of their degree. The registration for APAAR /ABC is continuing to ensure proper implementation of NEP-2020.

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
