Student Categorization & Action Taken

Based on initial assessments and previous semester results, students were categorized to provide made-to-order support:

Category	Identification Criteria	Support Provided
Slow Learners	Below 45% marks / irregular attendance.	Extra remedial classes, simplified notes, and peer-to-peer tutoring.
Advanced Learners	Above 75% marks / high engagement.	Recommended advanced reference books and leadership roles.
Average Learners	Consistent performance (45-75%).	Focused on improving presentation skills and career goal setting.

Problem Addressed

During the periodic meetings held in the 2024-25 session, the following areas were discussed:


1. **Academic:** Difficulty in specific subjects, unavailability of certain Hindi language textbooks, and preparation for internal exams.
2. **Personal/Social:** Issues regarding transportation to Ahiraula, balancing household responsibilities with studies, and digital literacy.
3. **Career:** Guidance on B.Ed. entrance exams, UPPSC/SSC preparation, and local vocational training opportunities through MoU.

Conclusion

1. **Improvement in Attendance:** A notable increase of approximately 85% in the mentees' regular attendance.
2. **Academic Growth:** 54 students showed significant improvement in their mid-term evaluations compared to the previous year.
3. **Holistic Development:** Increased participation in college-level debates, sports, and NSS activities.
